A lot of new people decided to add the most valuable card around to their purse or wallet last year. There are now 12,084 total BPL cardholders.



METROSHARE LIBRARY CARDS

If you live in Burleson, Decatur, Forest Hill, Haltom City, Haslet, Keller, Richland Hills, Roanoke, Saginaw, or Watauga, we accept your library card! There are a few collections we limit to Benbrook cardholders, but patrons can place holds, log on to the computers, and pick up their holds at our library.

DO YOU HAVE YOUR LIBRARY CARD?

THERE ARE MANY BENEFITS TO **GETTING A CARD AT BPL**

BENBROOK RESIDENT CARD

In order to sign up for a resident card, patrons must present a valid stateissued ID with a Benbrook address or 76126 zip code on it and a piece of recent, first class mail with the same address.

BENBROOK NON-RESIDENT CARD

To get a non-resident library card, you must have a valid state-issued ID and a piece of mail with the same address on it. Those who live in the service area of one of our partner libraries or in Fort Worth are ineligible.

TEXSHARE CARD

If you are a resident of Fort Worth and have a library card with Fort Worth Public Library, you may obtain a TexShare card from Fort Worth. Then, you may bring that TexShare card, along with a valid state-issued ID and a piece of mail with the same address on it, to our library to obtain one of our cards.

Certain collections, including digital content, are unavailable to TexShare patrons.

BOOKS

OVER 40,000 BOOKS FOR ADULTS, TEENS, AND CHILDREN



We have book collections for all ages. Each includes fiction, non-fiction, biographies, and audiobooks. Our special sub-collections include large print for adults, Spanish language books for all ages, graphic novels for teens and adults, and picture books, board books, easy readers, and award winners for children.

MEDIA

OVER 6,000 DVDS FOR ALL AGES



We have a wide selection of popular movies, TV shows, documentaries, and educational videos on DVD and Blu-ray. Cardholders are welcome to check out up to ten videos at a time. Our Binge Boxes give you a themed collection of multiple movies all at once for when you'd like to have a marathon movie watching session.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

The Library of Things is a collection of kits that facilitate a variety of educational, recreational, and practical activities. Kits in the collection include musical instruments, a telescope, video games, a projector, knitting supplies, and more. Most kits contain books and other materials that provide instruction and guidance on the activity they support. Library of Things kits are available to Benbrook Public Library cardholders ages 18 and up and are limited to one per borrower.

Our early literacy kits for children include themed combinations of books, toys, games, and other manipulatives to encourage a love of reading. You'll find kits on bugs, dinosaurs, bedtime, and more!

We have video games available for Switch, Xbox One and Playstation 4 game consoles. Adult Benbrook residents, non-residents and Metroshare card holders are welcome to check out two video games at a time for three weeks.

Our Seed Library offers local gardners a variety of fruit, vegetable and flower seeds to choose from. If you would like to save seeds from your harvest and share them with the community, just bring them by the library and donate them to the seed collection.



Benbrook resident and non-resident cardholders may request that items owned by our partner MetroShare libraries be sent to our library for convenient pick up. Interlibrary loan service allows Benbrook cardholders to borrow items from libraries throughout the country. Resident cardholders may also get a Texshare card, which grants borrowing privileges from many public and academic libraries throughout Texas.

COMPUTER ACCESS @ THE LIBRARY

We have 10 Adult Computers that have Windows 10 and Microsoft Office. Users are allotted up to 3 hours per day. Printing is 10¢ per side for black & white and 25¢ per side for color.

There are 5 computers in the Teen Room, including an iMac, and 6 computers in the children's area. Reservations are accepted when all computers are in use.

We have laptops available for in-library use. You may also access our free Wi-Fi on your own device. Print wirelessly from your laptop, phone, or tablet. You can even send your print job from home and pick it up!

TAKE TECHNOLOGY HOME!



Wi-Fi hotspots enable the internet to come home with you! Connect up to 10 devices to one hotspot. We have fifty in our collection, and each device has unlimited data, so no more worries about data usage!



Our 2-in-1 laptop computers are loaded with Open Office to allow for work with word processing, spreadsheets, and slideshow presentations and feature a camera for video conferencing or chatting. An internet connection is required to use the internet. We also have Chromebook/hotspot combos.



Roku Streaming Sticks provide access to streaming movies, TV shows, music, and more through various channels and services. Channels available on BPL streaming sticks include Vudu, Netflix, HBO Max, Disney Plus and more! All you need to enjoy a streaming stick is a TV or monitor with an HDMI port, as well as a Wi-Fi connection. The devices are highly portable and can easily be taken with you to enjoy at a friend's house, hotel, or anywhere else.

Download & Stream

libby

Libby offers a large selection of ebooks, audiobooks, and magazines for checkout. You can checkout 3 items at a time, and each item can be borrowed for up to 14 days.



- Download the Libby app on your phone or tablet.
- Sign in using your library card.
- Browse the collection of ebooks and audiobooks.
- When you find an item, click borrow.
- Choose to download the item or read/listen in an internet browser.

To browse magazines, click on "Subjects" and then click "Magazines". You may check out as many as you like!

kanopy

Benbrook Library gives you 6 credits to watch movies each month. Depending on the title, you have 48 or 72 hours to finish a film after pressing play. You can see remaining time at My Lists > Continue watching. Kanopy Kids requires no credits!

- Download the Kanopy app for your mobile device or access Kanopy on your desktop or SmartTv apps like Roku, AppleTV, and Fire Stick.
- Select "Add Library Card" button on bottom left.
- Enter your Benbrook library card number.
- Create an account using your preferred email.
- Browse thousands of critically acclaimed movies, documentaries, and kids' favorites.
- Borrow instantaneously!

cloudLibrary

CloudLibrary offers a collection of over 170,000 ebooks and audiobooks to enjoy. You can checkout 3 items at a time, and each item can be borrowed for up to 14 days.

→ To Access cloudLibrary ←

- Download the cloudLibrary app (it's free!). Or, visit yourcloudlibrary.com on your computer.
- In cloudLibrary, choose your state and library.
 Create an account using your Benbrook library card number (on the back of your library card) and the pin associated with your library card. Your pin will be the last four digits of your library card number unless you customized it.
- Browse the collection of ebooks and audiobooks.
- When you find an item you want, click on the title and then click "Borrow."
- Borrowed titles appear under "My Books" in the app.
 You can stream your items or download them to your device to enjoy them offline.



With hoopla, you can borrow movies, music, ebooks, audiobooks, and comics. Titles can be borrowed immediately, and the length of time an item can be borrowed depends on the item type. You may borrow 10 items per month with hoopla.

→ To Access hoopla ←

- Download the hoopla app on your phone or tablet.
- Create an account (you'll need your library card).
- Browse movies, music, and more.
- When you find an item, click borrow.
- Stream or download the item to view/listen to it.



Board of Trustees

The Benbrook Library is governed by a five-member board of trustees. This board is elected by you, the voters of Benbrook. Each trustee is elected for a two-year term. The terms are staggered, so there is a Library Board election each year. Library trustees must be residents of Benbrook and registered voters.

The Board of Trustees meets monthly, usually on the third Monday, at 6:30 PM. These meetings are open to the public, and we invite you to attend. The agenda is posted in the library and on our website at least three days prior to each meeting and notice of the meetings is usually listed on the city cable channel.

THE EQUIPMENT

MAKE AN APPOINTMENT TODAY THROUGH THE LIBRARY WEBSITE

Laser Engraving

We currently have a **Zing 50 Watt laser engraving machine** by Epilog. The bed size is 24"x12" and will cut 1/8" wood or acrylic. We also have a rotator that will allow you to print on cylindrical tumblers and mugs, etc. Materials available are wood @ \$.05/sq.in and acrylic @ \$.10/sq.in plus tax. Free if you bring your own material.

3D Printing

We have three (3) **Polyprinter 229 model** 3D Printers available for use. We primarily use ABS plastic and Ninja flex. Cost is calculated at \$.10/gram plus tax. For ideas: www.thingiverse.com

Cricut

We have the **Maker Cricut** that will cut most materials, including vinyl, cardstock, leather, pleather, and numerous other materials. We also have a good selection of pens to draw with on your projects. Our supplies are all at cost plus tax.

Poster Printer

We have the **Canon Imageprograf 4100 Poster Printer** to handle all your poster needs. We have two (2) sizes of paper, 24" and 36" wide. We have bond, glossy, and canvas paper available. All files must be in PDF format to print successfully on a flash drive, preferred. The final cost is determined by the ink, paper, and material type used, plus tax.





ABOUT THE SPACE

The Makerspace is small but is capable of handling your big ideas. The Makerspace area is home to the laser engraver and the 3D printers. The poster printer is located at the front of the library, and the other options we offer can be used in various areas of the library. Feel free to come to learn and create by making your appointment today.
